

Outreach Ministry 2021

Outreach is very proud of its work in our local communities and abroad. We seek to serve Christ through serving our neighbor. Our mission is to bring parishioners together to help others, especially those in need of food, water, shelter, clothing, and educational opportunities.

While we were uncertain for what 2021 would bring, the commission decided to trust in the Lord to provide what will be needed. We spent almost all of our funds to help fill many requests in our community - It was one of our biggest years yet! Please pray for our work in 2022.

GRANTS

Grants are awarded during two grant cycles to applicants serving the needs of others, locally & internationally.

We were able to award \$13,516 in 2021.

CHRISTMAS

Our Christmas drives sponsored 70 children and teens this year. This represents hundreds of gifts of clothing, shoes, toys, books, & toiletries provided to children in local school districts whose families don't have the means to provide gifts. Most are experiencing homelessness, are unaccompanied minors, or food insecure.

We also continued our work with US Vets. Snacks and warm clothing accessories were donated to local veterans in need.

- \$3000 to JustCoffee to help fund health insurance losses due to Covid19
- \$750 to victims of violent crimes through the Prescott Police Victims Services
- Emotional help books and activities to the PUSD Resource Center
- \$1100 in books & cash donation to Bring on the Books for Yavapai Schools
- \$750 for Thanksgiving Food Boxes to the Paulden Food Bank
- \$500 to Coyote Springs Elementary for Art Supplies
- Two \$1000 scholarships to local graduating seniors
- \$700 to Warm 4 Winter to make coat racks
- \$500 in US Relief funds to Episcopal Relief & Development
- Two annual blood drives
- Camp Genesis Backpacks
- Perysville Women's Prison
